


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The Legend of Shankhadhar is a biopic on Shankhadhar Saakhwa, an ordinary trader who lived 1,137 years ago in Kathmandu, Nepal. As per the legends, he encountered a great deal of gold and used it to free all his countrymen of debt and hence starting a new era called "Nepal Samvat"; which is still in use. The era was suppressed by the reigning rulers of Nepal until a few decades ago, which the movie aims to revoke through re-telling the legends related to it. The movie also relates the present state of Kathmandu following the April 2015 earthquake, with the prosperous Kathmandu of a thousand years ago.







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Poets in Heaven








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I Am Just Like You is a film dedicated to the many children and young people fleeing their homes in search of safety.

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This artwork portrays the Kurdish version of the legend of **Kawa, the blacksmith**. The legend forms the basis of the origin story of the new year's and springtime feast Newroz, as celebrated nowadays by Kurds on March 21st. It symbolizes the reawakening of spring, as well as the original connection between nature and all people living in the Mesopotamian region. Legend has it that Kawa, a simple craftsman, defeated the tyrant Dahak and then lit a great fire as a symbol of victory and joy.


